#### Restoring Padilla Bay's Vital Tidal Marsh

Thanks to a grant from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, Washington State's Padilla Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve recently acquired 74.5 acres of marshlands. This \$2.3 million NOAA award allows the reserve to permanently protect and restore this area and is part of a broader effort to restore up to 105 acres. For the communities that depend on the marsh, this effort will play a pivotal role in building climate resilience by mitigating the flooding risk for critical infrastructure.

#### Home Elevation Program Helps Demystify the Process

When residents of the Florida Keys wanted information on elevating their homes out of the floodplain, the City of Key West and local partners stepped in to help. The partners developed workshops and educational materials for contractors and homeowners to make the process less daunting. By including real-life examples specific to the Keys, the workshops armed participants with information about local ordinances and services in their municipality.
