Updates to Digital Coast Tool

User Feedback Drives Data Server Improvements

With content from more than 800 sources, NOAA's Digital Coast is the go-to website for coastal communities and businesses. Ten thousand to 15,000 data processing requests are received each month. To improve accessibility, website developers recently instituted improvements to the site's data access viewer (affectionately known as "DAV") and asked users to help test the beta system. Over 2,700 people volunteered. This level of user engagement ensured the final product was ready to meet the evolving needs of the customer base.

Alaska Added to the Sea Level Rise Viewer (and More!)

NOAA's Sea Level Rise Viewer received a series of updates recently, one of which includes adding 26 Alaskan communities to the tool for the first time. The update included minimizing the file size of the data to allow for downloading over low bandwidth, which is common in these areas. While there, don't forget to check out the Local Scenarios tab. Our tutorial teaches users how to get the most functionality out of this feature, such as comparing time and climate scenarios for your location.

Additional updates include:

- Remapped with new elevation data for Washington, California, American Samoa, Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island
- Added half-foot increments of sea level rise
- Added U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico visualizations—Puerto Rico for the first time!

Summer Internship Program Fosters Homegrown Environmental Stewards in the Northern Mariana Islands

A summer internship program in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) is preparing the next generation of environmental stewards through mentorship and handson experience. The program pairs local post-secondary students with mentors from natural resource agencies to complete conservation projects that build capacity in the islands. Since 2002, the program has supported over 200 interns—like Dianne (pictured above), who returned to the islands to start a full-time career with the CNMI coastal program.
